## Introduction

Westat has surveyed adult daycare centers participating in the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) in fiscal year 2023 to better understand their characteristics, services offered, populations served, and any barriers to participation. Because the CACFP program for adult daycare centers has been understudied, this information fills an important need for FNS.

Survey administration began on January 12, 2024, and continued through March 6, 2024. The overall survey response rate for this data collection effort is 47.7 percent.

Data tables are presented for survey responses overall, by sponsor status (independent vs sponsored), by ownership status (private for-profit, private nonprofit, and public), and by center size (less than 50 participants vs 50 or more participants). Statistically significant differences between subgroups were assessed using t-tests; results significant at the 0.05 confidence level are reported. Data are suppressed for cell sizes less than 10.


